PROCLAMATION.

"I, Brigham Young, Gores not and Superinkalent of Indian Affairs for the Terrifore of Ulah, in the name of the people of

the United States in the Territory of Utab. let. Forbil all armed forces of every doscription from coming into this Territory under any pretext whatever,

23. That all the forces in said Territory hold themselves in readiness to march at a moment's notice to recel any and all such

interion. 3. Marial law is bereby declared to exist in this Territory from and after the tablication of this proclamation; and no person shall be allowed to pass and repuss late or through or from the Territory, without a permit from the proper Officer. Oren under my hand and soul at Oreat Salt Lake City, Territory of Utab, this 15th day of Soptember, A. D. 1857, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the 833.
